43. Chapter Twelve (1906–2010): Review and Closure Session

This is a teacher's guide for the final class session, not a history chapter. It lays out a plan to review Chapter Twelve and help students apply what they learned across the whole church-history study. It uses a food-matching game to recall key 20th-century figures and movements.

Key takeaways

- The session reinforces Chapter Twelve and pushes students to apply their study to daily Christian life.
- A matching game links foods to ten people/movements: Russian Orthodox Church, Karl Barth, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the Scopes 'Monkey Trial' (William Bryan), Pentecostals, Popes John XXIII and John Paul II, the World Council of Churches, and Billy Graham.
- It closes with worship, life-application discussion, a Gavin White reflection, and prayer to use their Christian heritage.
- Digging Deeper suggests videos (Bonhoeffer, The Hiding Place, Inherit the Wind, Shadowlands) and readings on fundamentalism and postmodernism.
